

4-H Grade Dairy Cattle or Leasing Identification Form

K-STATE Research and Extension

This identification must be updated or submitted to the local K-State Research and Extension office by June 15 of the current year to qualify the animal for state shows. The original ID form and picture must be kept by the 4-H'er for presentation at the Kansas All Breeds Show. It also must be available at the Kansas State Fair if requested by an official. A copy can be kept in the local Extension office. No forms will be sent to the State 4-H Office. Most shows require this ID to be presented at check-in. Dairy animals that lack proper ID certificates by June 15 cannot be shown at state shows. Please attach a standard-size photo.

Leasing Option:

Youth may lease a maximum of two animals per year for their 4-H Dairy Cattle project. This form (MG54) must be completed for each animal. This policy may be different from some breed associations if you desire to show out-of-state or at association-sponsored shows.
